

Your Vote Should Count

Midterm elections this November are constantly in the news. Many of the news and political shows try to predict the future. My belief is that it is impossible, because so many events will occur in these next five months that none of us have any control over.. What has been in the courts that will hopefully make the elections more honest and, therefore, reflect the will of the nation. The courts have confirmed election day is one day only, but that has been covered well so it will not be considered in this article.

I will try to inform you about some of the issues that are confirmed but not covered by all the media. Almost anything of apolitical nature is opposed in court by litigation. Several groups argue about almost everything. They are in alphabetical order: the ACLU, Democracy Defender and Legal Defense Funds on the left and Judicial Watch on the right. This of course is not an exhaustive list but names I have seen repeatedly in court dockets.

Here are some of the issues. Oregon has at least 800,000 inactive voters and they had automatic voter registration and admit they have non-citizens mistakenly registered. In the 2026 election law court report it states that the courts have forced nearly six million removals from registration in California,

Colorado, District of Columbia, Indiana, Kentucky, New York City, North Carolina, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. You will notice these are both blue and red states. The Washington, DC Board of Election revealed 388 non-citizens voted in the last election and has agreed to remove 103,000 voters. In Maine, they registered 101% of the eligible voters. New Hampshire wants proof of citizenship to register but is being sued to prevent that. Pennsylvania is being sued to force them to accept late mail-in ballots and those with errors, like no signature. The following were in the news but seldom explained.

In Georgia's Fulton County who later put President Trump on trial for trying to reverse the 2020 election. The story, in short, Biden won by 11,759 votes, but on election day, the Secretary of State reported that Trump was leading by 103,705 votes with 94,000 left to count. Yet, four days later, 74,000 absentee ballots had grown to 148,000.

The most recent issue ruled on by the courts was in North Carolina where their laws allowed anyone whose parents lived in North Carolina before they moved overseas could vote in North Carolina even if never a resident. This irregularity was contested on 65,000 people of the 5.5 million. Court ruled non-residents have no status for voting in any state.

Another issue in the law was that many states are calling for proof of citizenship and a picture ID to register to vote. According to several of the polls 80% to 90% of the voters agree with this issue. This huge majority continues in all demographic groups. This should be an easy decision for "The people's representatives" but they cannot get the votes necessary to pass such a law. You can make up your own mind as to the reason.

Homegrown Purchase Assistance Program

The Chicago Department of Housing announced the HomeGrown Purchase Assistance Program, a new initiative designed to help eligible homebuyers achieve ownership by providing assistance for down payments and closing costs. Funded with \$21 million from Mayor Johnson's \$1.25 billion Housing and Economic Development Bond, the Program was created to address the growing affordability challenges facing low and moderate-income level families in today's market.

Mortgage payments often provide more predictable long-term housing costs compared to rising rents, allowing families to build equity and create assets that can be passed down to future generations.

Assistance is targeted by income and geography, with eligible properties set in Zone A or Zone B. Zone A includes areas where neighborhoods have experienced significant increases in home sale prices. Zone B includes low-income census tract areas where 70% or more families have incomes below 80% of the statewide median family income.

Eligible homebuyers must meet income and mortgage requirements, complete homebuyer education counseling, and contribute at least 1% of the original purchase price from personal funds. Grant funds may not exceed 25% of the property purchase price before any other purchase assistance is applied.

Neighborhood Lending Services, INC. an affiliate of NHS Chicago and TRP Lending, LLC, an affiliate of The Resurrection Project were selected via Request For Proposal to administer the program.

To protect the City's investment and support long-term neighborhood stability, participating homebuyers must occupy the purchased home as their principal residence for a minimum of five years.

Property Tax Sale Reform Legislation

Sweeping property tax foreclosure reforms pushed by Cook County Treasurer Maria Pappas passed May 30th in the Illinois General Assembly and now head to the governor's desk.

Once signed by Governor JB Pritzker, the reform package will be the most significant Illinois homeowner protection measure enacted in decades.

House Bill 4537 will bring Illinois into compliance with the 2023 U.S. Supreme Court ruling in Tyler v. Hennepin. The court found that when governments foreclose on a property for unpaid taxes, any equity above the debt owed must be returned to the property owner.

Each year, under current Illinois law, overdue taxes on homes, commercial properties, and vacant lots are sold to tax buyers. In return, the buyers receive a lien entitling them to take deed to the property and any equity the owner has in it, if the owner doesn't pay what's owed within one to three years.

With this legislation, the old system will be replaced by one that returns to the former property owner any equity above what was owed. It was crafted with input from Cook County President Toni Preckwinkle, downstate county treasurers and

housing advocates, and in collaboration with state Sen. Celina Villanueva (D-Chicago) and state Rep. Curtis Tarver (D-Chicago).

The core reform in HB 4537 is the creation of a tax deed auction system already used in many other states. Taxes, interest, and fees owed will be paid by the highest bidder. Remaining surplus equity will be returned to the former property owner by the county treasurer.

The legislation requires Cook County to hold six more tax sales involving private tax buyers. After the sixth sale, expected to occur in 2030, tax buying will no longer be allowed in Cook County. Instead, the county will hold all the liens for overdue property taxes, and if the property owner doesn't pay what's owed within one to three years, the county can auction off the property's deed to the highest bidder.

Ending private tax buying benefits owners struggling to keep their homes because it enables the county to offer payment plans, with longer pay-back periods, at reduced interest rates, before the property is sent to auction.

Other counties could adopt the same tax sale phaseout as Cook County but are not required to do so.

The American Cancer Society has released updated guidelines for colorectal cancer screening. The new recommendations reaffirm that average-risk adults should begin screening at age 45 and continue through age 75 for those with a life expectancy greater than 10 years. ACS is now adding guidelines for a blood-based screening test taken in a doctor's office, as well as one updated and one new at-home screening option that looks for hidden blood and molecular markers in stool samples. The move reflects advances in disease detection and a shift in public health strategy to expand screening options and lower barriers to access.
