New Cameras For Speed Enforcement

The City of Chicago has begun issuing warnings at 16 new automated speed enforcement camera locations near schools and parks. Warning notices (without fines) will be issued for the first 30 days after each new camera is activated. Following the warning period and 14-day blackout period, citations will be issued to the registered owners of vehicles exceeding the speed by six miles per hour (mph) or more. Vehicles traveling 6-10 mph over the speed limit will be fined \$35 while those traveling 11 mph or more over the limit will be fined \$100.

Chicago's speed camera program is one of several tools used to support the City's efforts to improve traffic safety, encourage safer driving, and reduce crashes through street design, traffic calming and pedestrian infrastructure improvements.

Local new cameras

are at 2728 S. Archer Ave - Palmisano Park and 3510 W. 55th st - Senka Park.

Additional locations will be added to the network throughout the year.

Automated enforcement hours for school zone cameras are limited to 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on school days. From 7 a.m. to 4 p.m., the speed limit is 20 mph when children are present and reverts to the posted speed limit when no children are present. From 4 to 7 p.m., the posted speed limit applies. For park zone cameras, enforcement is limited to the hours when each park is open-typically from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m., seven days a week.

All automated enforcement systems include signs and pavement markings clearly indicating to drivers that they are entering an automated speed enforcement Safety Zone.

Nordhaus-Bike Publishes Article



Scholar, artist, and communications professional Anne Nordhaus-Bike has a scholarly article published in the *Rose+Croix Journal*, Volume 19, March 2025.

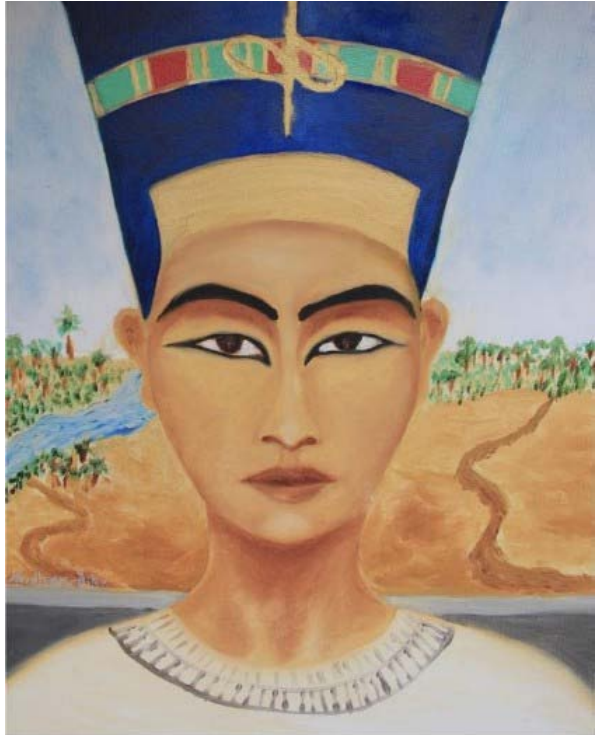
Other women covered in the article, particularly

Through October, ARC is partnering with local animal organizations to offer low-cost or free 1-year rabies and distemper vaccines as well as microchips. These partnerships ultimately link pet owners to organizations in their area for year-round pet care.

Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle will attend the first clinic at the River Grove American Legion, 8664 Grand Ave., River

Grove on April 5th from 11:30 a.m. to noon.

Data from Cook County's Social Vulnerability Index was used to select some of this year's clinic locations. The analysis ranks socioeconomic status, demographic factors, language proficiency, housing conditions and transportation availability. This data-driven approach ensures that clinics are positioned to serve communities where they are most needed.
