



Thanks To All The Dads Out There

Fathers' Day is a good time to contemplate how important they are. We have seen many statistics on TV about the importance of fathers. Mostly in commercials for lawyers among others who talk about fatherless families. The GITNEX Report 2026 has a very long article about the issue. I will use it to try to inform you of some of what they found.

It is important to understand these percentages and most recall that if 65% of my neighbors like broccoli, it means 35% do not. Sounds like almost everyone, but it also means that 35 out of every 100 do not like it. Keep this in mind because none of these stats show 100%, meaning that it does not mean all fatherless families have these issues.

The article I found verified all their findings. It was written by Lars Eriksen and verified on May 5, 2026. The other

items he mentioned are not in this article. The following are in fatherless homes:

Criminal justice enrollment: 63% of youth suicides; 85% of youth in prison; 72% of adolescent murderers; 84% of sex offenders; 68% of child support non-payers.

Economic impact: four times more likely to live in poverty; 20% less income by age 30; 3.2 times higher rates of utility shut offs; 75% of adolescents in chemical abuse centers; 70% of long term welfare recipients.

Educational outcomes: 85% of children with failing grades; three times higher special education placement; 1.8 times higher truancy; 30% lower Math proficiency; 90% of children expelled.

Health and wellbeing: 40% higher trauma scores; 45% higher emotional instability; 70% of long term alcoholism; 92% of IV drug users; 55% pedophilia victims.

Social behavior: 60% of the homeless under 30; 50% higher abortion rates; 36.9% higher rate of nonmarital child bearing persistence; 71% of unwed mothers; 29% high rate of hypertension.

These statistics help us understand what fatherless families have to overcome. Be grateful for those families with Dads as we can see their importance. Thank you to all who have helped serve that role in one manner or another to try to help the children of your family or friends.

Framework Delivers Micromobility Safety

Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias' micromobility safety legislation passed the Illinois General Assembly and now awaits Governor JB Pritzker's signature, bringing Illinois one step away from establishing the state's first comprehensive framework to regulate high-speed e-bikes, e-motos and other powerful electric transportation devices operating on roads, bike lanes, bike paths and sidewalks.

Senate Bill 3484 is the cornerstone of Giannoulias' Ride Safe, Ride Smart, Ride Ready campaign – a first-of-its-kind statewide effort to address the rapid rise of electric mobility devices through education, training, enforcement and modernized safety standards.

As increasingly powerful e-bikes, e-motos and other devices become more common on Illinois streets and trails, the campaign seeks to prevent crashes before they happen by equipping riders, parents, motorists and communities with the tools, information and regulations needed to safely share the road. The initiative comes as micromobility-related injuries and fatalities nationwide surged 300 percent between 2019 and 2022.

The initiative focuses on higher-powered, higher-speed devices that fall outside current state definitions or remain largely unregulated, including certain e-bikes, e-motos and electric scooters, electric skateboards and electric unicycles. Illinois currently has no laws governing e-bikes and other micromobility devices that exceed 28 mph. Many of these devices have motors that exceed 750 watts and can travel well beyond 28 mph – in some cases highway speeds of over 75 mph.

Illinois will maintain its current three-class e-bike structure, which covers pedal bicycles with electric motors up to 750 watts that travel 20-28

mph – a framework already used in 46 other states. Under the proposal, those classifications would remain unchanged except for new age requirements that a rider on a Class 1 or Class 2 e-bike must be at least 15 years old.

Under the legislative framework: Riders of e-bikes and e-motos capable of traveling over 28 mph would be required to have a driver's license, title, registration and insurance. Micromobility devices such as e-scooters, electric skateboards and electric unicycles would be prohibited from operating over 28 mph on roads, bike lanes, bike paths and sidewalks. In addition, riders of any electric micromobility device must be at least 16 years old.

The legislation establishes statewide consistency, replacing the current patchwork of local ordinances that vary widely from one municipality to another.

If signed into law, the bill would take effect on January 1, 2027. E-bikes and e-motos purchased prior to that date would be exempt from the title requirement but would require title and registration to be operated on Illinois roads.

Along with the legislation, the Ride Safe, Ride Smart, Ride Ready campaign will deliver: Statewide public awareness outreach for parents, riders and retailers. Updated driver education materials focused on sharing the road safely. Law enforcement guidance and community safety partnerships, and Outreach to schools and municipalities on responsible micromobility use.

Senate Bill 3484 was approved with bipartisan support in both the House and Senate and will be sent to Governor JB Pritzker for consideration.

City Safety Plan To Prevent Violence

As the city recognizes National Gun Violence Awareness Month, the Chicago Department of Public Health is expanding its 2026 Summer Injury Prevention Initiative, to reduce gun violence, prevent opioid overdoses, and connect residents to lifesaving services through September in neighborhoods most impacted.

Trained outreach teams will canvass neighborhoods this year, providing residents with naloxone (Narcan®) and the education needed to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose. Engagement teams will extend this work throughout evenings, weekends, holidays, at community events, and summer festivals.

During the 2025 summer initiative, partner organizations processed more than 1,000 samples. Information gathered informs the public through CDPH's Health Alert Network. Read the most recent HAN alert: Street Drug Surveillance Update - June 1, 2026.

This summer, CDPH is expanding programs that connect residents to care, recovery support, crisis response, and victim services.

Residents seeking support can also access the

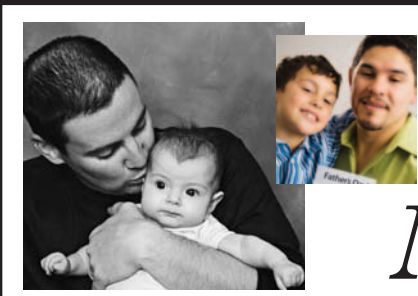

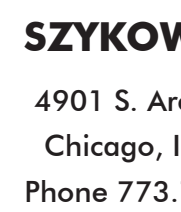
