



More Schools Closed

Some people of our area are suffering through an unstable period that sadly many of us in the area have gone through before -- the closing of a school that was part and partial to their community. The schools closing this year affecting our community are St. Richard/St. Bruno, which had combined at 5025 S. Kenneth and St. Jerome, 2801 S. Princeton. Both of these schools gave parents in our area a choice for their children's education.

These Catholic schools had an impact on parish life for many years. Many of them especially helped the immigrant communities adjusting to the USA and to many especially before TV was an effective way to learn English. When thinking about the baby boom era, the Archdiocese saved the city millions of dollars by running their schools and paying for their teachers.

The Archdiocese released figures that they had enrolled at one time about 366,000 and there was no Pre-K at that time. By 2024 with many of the schools having a Pre-K the enrollment was down to about 67,000. The Superintendent of Archdiocesan schools, Greg Richmond, in a letter to the families wrote that the big need was students and funds. He stated that over the years, some parishes tried heroic measures. Some parishes simply could not. He mentioned as contributing factors were the growth of the charter

schools in the 1990s and the clergy sex abuse scandals of the 2000s.

Recently St. Richard / St. Bruno has about 190 students. St. Jerome has about 100 students. These figures may vary a little according to the newspapers. Neither would have the tuition income high enough to pay the bills. I have heard several people talk about the "wealth" of the Catholic Church" and "it's so rich the schools should not have tuition". I worked as both a teacher, administrator and principal as an employee of the Archdiocese. I was a parent of students and a principal having the responsibility of a school closing. It was hard. But I quickly learned that a huge amount of "the wealth" is in property and artwork. Have you tried to sell a church at its valued price? It's impossible. I was active in selling a large parish school with a church, rectory, and convent. The value was an estimated \$17 million. After three years on the market, the Bishop in charge accepted \$600,000.

I believe, in general, that the labor cost became too much. Vocations to the Sisters of teaching orders had dropped dramatically. You can pick your own reason why this occurred. But the fact is with very few exceptions, the orders, many of which came from Europe to serve their immigrant communities, dwindled. Despite their attempts we are no longer supplied with a large workforce, who have taken the vow of poverty.

I owe a lot to the great teachers and administrators my family was blessed to have. I also have had the privilege to have worked with and supervised many Sisters in the Archdiocese. You may be a great help to those worried about the schools that their children will attend next year. Be very truthful. Hopefully, the parents will find the best fit for their children.

Pulaski Day At Polish Musuem

General Kazimierz Pulaski (b. Warsaw, Poland, March 6, 1745 – d. near Savannah, Georgia, October 9-10, 1779) is recognized as the "Father of the American Cavalry." He offered his services to the American Continental Army during the American Revolutionary War. At Brandywine, in 1777, he distinguished himself by leading a daring attack against the British, thereby saving the retreating American Army.

In October of 1779, at the age of 34, General Pulaski died from wounds received while leading a cavalry charge in Savannah, Georgia. His remains were reinterred at the Pulaski Monument at Monterey Square in Savannah, GA in October of 2005.

In 1973, Illinois made Casimir Pulaski Day a commemorative holiday, and then in 1985, a bank and school holiday.

Baez Exhibition At MCA Chicago

The Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago, 220 E. Chicago ave. announces the presentation of Firelei Báez, the first North American survey exhibition of the artist (b.1980, Santiago de los Caballeros, Dominican Republic). Spanning two decades of her practice, this exhibition showcases vibrant and captivating paintings and installations. Through a bold visual language that blends folklore, fantasy, mythology and science fiction, Báez constructs layered worlds that challenge historical narratives and unsettle the categories of race, gender and nationality.

In addition to her paintings, the exhibition will feature A *Drexycen chronocommons* (2019) (to win the war you fought it sideways) (2019), which will occupy an entire gallery.

This large-scale work consists of paintings, mesh, papier-mâché, cutout tarp and plants. Chicago is also highlighted in the exhibition: *The trace, whether we are attending to it or not (a space for each other's breathing)* (2019) features a ciguapa (a feminine, trickster creature from Dominican folklore) bending over an architectural plan of the Illinois Central Railroad, uniting both sides of the tracks, which run between New Orleans and Chicago.

The MCA is open 10 am to 5 pm Wednesday to Sunday and Tuesdays from 10 am to 9 pm. Tuesday evenings (5-9 pm) are free for Illinois residents. Admission is free for all youth 18 and under, members of the military and veterans. Visit mchicago.org or (312) 280-2660.

Winning Names for “Name A Snowplow”

Mayor Brandon Johnson and the Department of Streets and Sanitation announced the six winning names for the City's fourth annual "You Name a Snowplow" contest. On February 1st, the City posted 25 finalists from the initial pool of names received. Residents were able to vote for up to six names through midnight on Feb. 14th.

The six names that received the most votes include: Abolish ICE, Stephen Colbert, Pope Frio XIV, The Blizzard of Oz, Svencoolie and Caleb Chilliams.

The City received a record number of entries (13,300) and voters (39,000) for this year's contest. The 'Chance the Scraper' entry received honorable mention due to finishing just .24% out of the top six.

Residents who first submitted the winning names (earliest time stamp when there are multiple submissions) will be offered a photo opportunity with the named snowplow, along

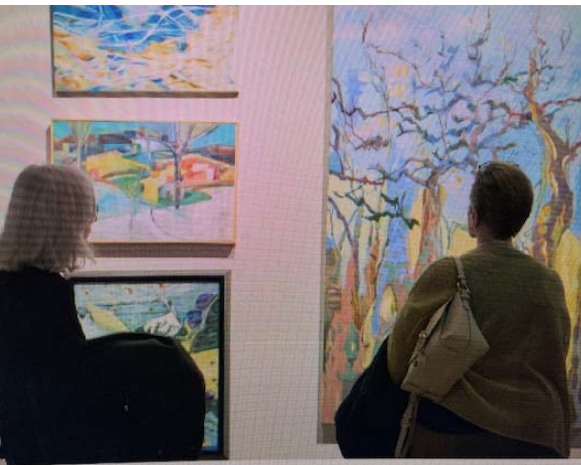
