The polls about the last election have shown that a large number of young people supported Trump in the November election. These polls indicate a huge gain over the young people's vote in 2020. Numerous people have been on the news that some consider the experts, have suggested that the programs like "The Young Leaders Program" sponsored by The Heritage Foundation, has given many bright students internships throughout the government in the Spring, Summer and Fall prior to the election.

The Heritage Foundation has worked as a policy consultant and think

tank since 1973. Several of these reporters have considered the foundation as being far right. The opportunity as government interns seems to have helped them understand that they were not alone in their beliefs and shared that knowledge with many others on campus. These efforts were noticed and, as you would expect, some reports were for and others against. A simple search of the internet is not hard if you wish to dig deeper.

In "Members' News" published by the Heritage Foundation in November, 2024 the Oversight Project discovered flyers at a migrant camp in Mexico that encouraged them to cross the border and vote in the American election. They also found videos of Georgia residents that admitted to being non-citizens but were registered to vote. This led to investigations by the authorities.

People can speculate about the Heritage Foundation or just ignore it. You make up your own mind. There are many other organizations that you may consider significant. I bring it up only because of the significant change in the youth voting results.

Career Exploration For CPS Students

About 1,600 high school juniors and seniors from Chicago Public Schools will be attending skilled trades career exploration as part of the District's efforts to increase exposure to a variety of postsecondary pathways. The events are part of an ongoing collaboration with City agencies, City Colleges, labor and corporate partners, bringing students together with government institutions, community-based organizations, and

companies offering access to training, internship opportunities, and potential employment.

CPS currently offers 34 Career and Technical Education pathways at more than 80 high schools, including 12 programs in construction trades, five in carpentry, three in electricity, three in welding, and one HVAC program. The programs allow students to gain work experience for in-demand careers as well as provide opportunities to earn early college credit and industry-recognized certifications and skills training at seven high schools.

The events are open to high school juniors and seniors who are interested in the trades and are eligible to apply to apprenticeships or bridge programs, which prepare students for entry into apprenticeships through technical skill development and academic readiness support. Students at the events will participate in sessions designed to give them hands-on experience in aspects of each skilled trade, program recruitment, and direct support to register for the next steps.

At the Skilled Trades events, City Colleges will introduce students to Career Launch Chicago and its innovative summer Aim to Launch program, which enables high school students to earn college credits in construction and advanced manufacturing at City Colleges of Chicago.

EMT Course At Marist High



Four Marist High School seniors are one step closer to becoming certified Emergency Medical Technicians: Ellie Fey, Timothy Graber, Ronnie Shalabi, and Christine Stephenson. They will take the certification exam, and with a passing grade, officially become certified. Chicago Ambulance Alliance has guaranteed job placement once they complete the certification process. The EMT course began in October, meeting three times a week from 5:30 to 10 p.m. Hands-on experience and training for trauma, medical, and behavioral patients was gained along with 48 hours of ride time in an ambulance, working alongside certified personnel. Beginning in the 2025-26 school year, the EMT program will be offered as a course to Marist seniors.

LEAP Sessions (Learn, Explore, and Play) at Lincoln Park Zoo lets ages 2-4 explore the natural world through play. Young ones guide the way in digging, creating art, playing with parts, or listening to stories. Commit to nine-week sessions on Wednesdays or Thursdays between March 19th and May 15th, or attend stand-alone Saturday classes on March 15th, and 29th, April 12th and 26th, or May 10th. These sessions take place at Pritzker Family Children's Zoo and Farm-in-the-Zoo. Cost is \$21 for each stand-alone class or \$165 for the series.

Steelmakers Exhibit At Griffin MSI

Griffin Museum of Science and Industry will debut *Steelmakers* exhibit that explores the science and stories behind one of the world's most essential and versatile materials, on March 6th.

A collection of artifacts and oral histories, will explain how steel became an indispensable part of our modern world, contributing to expansive industrial growth and creating steelworker communities in Chicago and the Calumet Region.

Steelmakers will teach guests about the science and metallurgy at tactile tables and share their experiences through oral histories. Interactives like an "Is It Steel or Not?" quiz and a Museum-wide scavenger hunt will illuminate the ubiquity of steel.

Artifacts on display include: Beams from Chicago's Home Insurance Building

(1885-1931), considered the world's first skyscraper; Olympic torch made of recycled steel; Richard Hunt Sculpture, *Angle Form* (1968); Inland Steel Skyscraper Model, displayed at the Century of Progress World's Fair (1933) and Steel Plate Signed by women steelworkers during World War II (1943).

The Chicago Board of Education approved the appointment of Elizabeth Mendoza Browne as the new chief of the Office of Student Protections and Title IX. Her career with CPS began in 2021, as Director of Investigations in the Office of Student Protections & Title IX. After six months, she transitioned to the position of Deputy Chief Title

IX Officer in 2022. Since July 2024, she has been serving as the District's Acting Chief Title IX Officer.

A Bachelor of Arts in Sociology was received from DePaul University and she was part of the inaugural cohort of the University of Chicago's Center for Effective Government Executive Leadership Seminar Series in 2023.

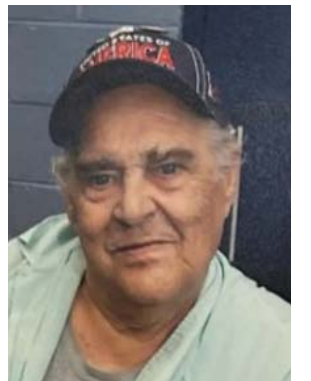
