The polls about the last election have shown last election have shown that a large number of young people supported Trump in the November election. These polls indicate a huge gain over the young people's vote in 2020. Numerous people have been on the news that some consider the have been on the news that some consider the experts, have suggested that the programs like "The Young Leaders Program" sponsored by The Heritage Founda-tion, has given many bright students internships throughout the government in the Spring, Summer and Fall prior to

the election. The Heritage Foundation has worked as a poli-cy consultant and think

tank since 1973. Several of these reporters have considered the foundation as being far right. The opportunity as government interns seems to have helped them understand that they were not alone in their beliefs and shared that knowledge with many others on campus. These efforts were noticed and, as you would expect, some reports were for and others against. A simple search of the inter-net is not hard if you wish to dig deeper.

In "Members' News" published by the Heritage Foundation in November, 2024 the Oversight Project discovered flyers at a migrant camp in Mexico that encouraged them to cross the border and vote in the American election. They also found videos of Georgia residents that admitted to being non-citizens but were registered to vote. This led to investigations by the authorities.

People can speculate about the Heritage Foundation or just ignore it. You make up your own mind. There are many other organizations that you may consider signifi-cant. I bring it up only because of the significant change in the youth voting results.



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
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
